

Part One: What is Voice Banking, Message Banking, & Double Dipping? (Costello & Smith, 2021)






Voice Banking: Process of recording long script that targets all speech sounds in your language. The recordings are then used to make a computerized voice that will sound like your natural voice



Message Banking: Process of recording and storing personalized messages, sounds, stories, etc. These are unprocessed and reflect your natural voice the day you recorded.







Double Dipping™

Voice Banking





Process of recording a randomized script into a voice banking website



Using a computer, Wi-Fi connection, microphone, and quiet space



May need to record anywhere from 50-1600 lines of script depending on the website you use

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How much does it cost?

- **Acapela**: \$999






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What is Double Dipping?






- Process of designing a computerized voice based off messages you have previously recorded
- Costello recommends recording 550-750 messages
- Clinical experience to date has shown speakers think these voices "more clearly approximate their biological voice compared to the voice created through voice banking alone." (Costello & Smith, 2021)

Double Dipping Website





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Equipment Needed



Voice Banking

- A quiet space
- Microphone
- WiFi connection
- Computer with use of Google Chrome
- Voice Keeper can be completed on your iPhone or iPad using their app

Message Banking

- A quiet space
- Zoom mic recorder
- AVR app for your phone or tablet
- WiFi connection
- Mytobiidynavox.com account or mymessagebanking.com

Part One: Review



Voice Banking

- -Requires anywhere from 50-1600 lines of script to be recorded
- -Analyzed by engineers and a computerized voice is designed
- -Costs money

Message Banking

- -Can record as many or as few messages, stories, sounds, as you'd like
- -These messages are unprocessed, sound exactly like you
- -Free

Double Dipping

- -Takes your banked messages (the more the better; 550-750) and designs a computerized voice based off these recordings
- -Costs money

Part Two: Is it right for me?



There's no "right" answer

Everyone has the right to make their own decision



Things to Consider



How does your voice sound right now?

Do you like the way your voice sounds now? If so, great. If not, then you may not be happy with the way your messages or personalized voice turn out



Do you have the time?

Make sure you have the time/dedication to complete

It doesn't need to be done in one sitting

Avoid: a busier time at work, if you're going on vacation, are you moving, do you have a lot of doctor appointments, etc.



What if I Speak a Different Language?

Acapela: Available in 19 different languages

Model Talker: English only right now, but can support some personalized messages and names in a Native language

Voice Keeper: English, Hebrew, & Spanish

Speak Unique: English only

What if I don't like the sound of my voice? Or I already lost my voice.





- Speak Unique has a voice repair option for persons that are exhibiting a mild to moderate dysarthria (difficulty speaking)
- Do you have a family member that sounds like you?
 - They can always record on your behalf
- Design your own voice
 - Speak Unique can design a voice for you based off your gender, age, and regional accent.
- Do you have previous recordings of your voice?
 - Speak Unique can make a voice based off your recordings.
- Many voice banking websites have generic voices for purchase

Part Two: Review









There's no "right" answer

Things to consider:
Your voice
Your schedule
Your preferences

Don't let cost preclude you: Team Gleason will cover the cost of your voice



Part Three: How do I get started?



Find a SLP

Identify the website you'd like to use

Identify equipment you'll need

Reach out to Team Gleason Decide what you want to record





- Although not required for the voice and message banking process, it has been found to be extremely helpful in navigation and completion of the process (Costello & Smith, 2021).
- Reach out to your local ALS clinic to see if they have a SLP that can assist you, OR, if they known of a local therapist that can.
 - In the Chicagoland area, Shirley Ryan AbilityLab can absolutely provide this service for you.
- If you do not have a SLP, Team Gleason can help support you.
- Benefits: they are already knowledgeable on all three processes, they'll have advice on how to complete the process, they may have equipment for you to borrow (or can complete the process in the session), someone to keep you on track, and check in, etc.

Reach out to Team Gleason



- Complete the application on their website, specifically referencing Voice and Message Banking
- Within the application they will ask you if you need specific equipment and if you need assistance with finding a SLP
- They will also ask if you need assistance with covering the cost
 - They will cover 100% of the cost



What should I record?



Voice Banking

Less freedom in what you record because they are trying to hit all combinations of letters/sounds in the English language

Most companies will provide you with a script, apart from Speak Unique, they allows you choose excerpts from specific stories they support (Alice in Wonderland, Peter Pan, The Jungle Book). Browse by category.

Message Banking

Laugh

Stories: Family stories or stories that you may read to your children or grandchildren

Cuss words

Family, friends, pet names

"Isms": You may reach out to family and friends to get a better idea of those things you always say.

Wants and needs

Part Three: Review



You do not need to go through this process alone

Finding a SLP can be helpful

Team Gleason can provide the cost of voice banking, as well as loan out any equipment you may need

Equipment is standard across both processes

Think of carrying around a pen/paper, reach out to family for ideas on what to record, carry a microphone or your phone on you for when you think of something to record

Part Four: Project Euphonia





Project Euphonia

Project Euphonia — part of Google's AI for Social Good program — aims to make technology more accessible by improving speech recognition for people with impaired speech. These improvements are only possible if we have speech samples to train the system.

Research Opportunity via Google



- Katie Seaver, the SLP at Google is currently working on recruiting a few more participants
- Longitudinal study with people that are newly diagnosed with a bulbar onset of ALS and a mild dysarthria (changes in voice).
- Involves recording messages every few weeks/months (depending on the changes in your voice)
- Paid for every virtual visit
- Google engineers hopefully will then be able to have a solution for their automated speech recognition technology



Part Four Review

- Project Euphonia is part of Google Research initiative to make voice recognition technology more accessible for people with disabilities.
- Google is looking to expand their technology to improve their automated speech recognition.
